

MELIÁ HOTELS INTERNATIONAL, S.A. (the “**Company**”), in compliance with Law 6/2023, of 17 March, on Securities Markets and Investment Services, in relation to article 17 of (EU) Regulation no.596/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 April 2014, hereby informs the National Securities Market Commission (**CNMV**) of the following:

OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

In light of the developments and evolving circumstances within the geopolitical, social, legal, and economic context of the Republic of Cuba, the Company, as part of its ongoing risk assessment process, hereby informs that its subsidiary, the Portuguese entity “Ilha Bela Gestão e Turismo, Ltd.” (“Ilha Bela”), has taken the decision to immediately terminate the provision of management and commercialization services, as well as the licensing of the use of its hotel brands, in relation to the following fifteen (15) hotels, all of which are located in the Republic of Cuba:

- Gran Hotel Bristol Habana Vieja Member of The Meliá Collection
- Ininside Catedral Habana
- Meliá Buena Vista
- Meliá Cayo Santa María
- Meliá Jardines del Rey
- Meliá Las Dunas
- Meliá Península Varadero
- Paradisus Los Cayos
- Paradisus Princesa Mar
- Paradisus Río de Oro
- Paradisus Varadero
- Sol Caribe Beach
- Sol Cayo Santa María
- Sol Río de Luna y Mares
- Sol Varadero Beach

This decision, which was initially communicated to the owners of these hotels on 26 May and has been confirmed today, has been adopted with a strong sense of corporate responsibility. It arises from a combination of supervening circumstances beyond Ilha Bela’s capacity to manage or control, all of which have had a significant impact on the operation, legality, and security of the provision of such services in relation to these hotels.

The impact of this decision is limited, as the vast majority of the aforementioned hotels are currently closed and not in operation due to the energy challenges and the decline in demand affecting the Republic of Cuba. Nevertheless, Ilha Bela is activating and implementing specific plans to carry out an orderly disengagement from these hotels. Likewise, appropriate protocols are being put in place to ensure transparent communication with suppliers and clients.

The Company appreciates the understanding and trust of all its stakeholders.
