

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CNMV IS APPOINTED VICE-CHAIRMAN OF THE OECD CORPORATE GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

• Among the functions of the Committee is the coordination of the Organisation's work regarding corporate governance, corporate finance and state-owned enterprises.

The chairman of the CNMV, Rodrigo Buenaventura, has been appointed vice-chairman of the OECD Corporate Governance Committee. The current chairman, Masato Kanda, Vice Minister of Finance of Japan, will continue to hold office.

Among the functions of the OECD Corporate Governance Committee is the coordination of the Organisation's work regarding corporate governance, corporate finance and state-owned companies, while supervising the implementation of the G20/OCDE Corporate Governance Principles and the Guidelines on Corporate Governance of State-Owned Enterprises. Likewise, it supports the dialogue with non-OECD members on corporate governance. The Committee holds Regional Roundtables on Corporate Governance with Asia, Latin America and the Middle East and North Africa.

Currently and after the support shown by the OECD ministers and the G20 leaders, the Committee is reviewing the G20/OCDE Corporate Governance Principles, a review that began in November 2021 and will conclude in 2023. These principles guide the member countries in terms of their own Corporate Government regulations or recommendations. In Spain they are reflected in the Code of Good Governance for Listed Companies endorsed and promoted by the CNMV.
